FAQs

Who can serve on the S.A.L.t. Team?

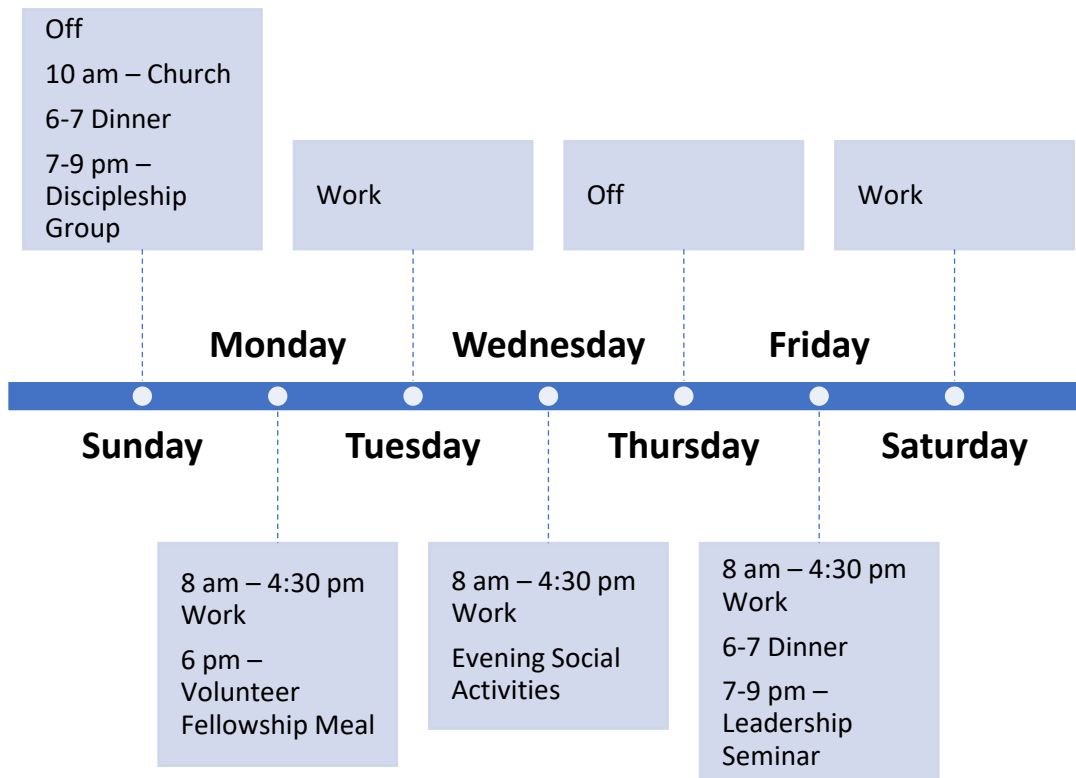
- Young adult Christians between the ages of 18 and 25, committed to growth in their walk with Jesus and working with God in His plan for the world.
- U.S. residents and international adults are encouraged to apply.

What is the 2024 schedule for S.A.L.t.?

- The S.A.L.T. program will **begin May 28th** and **conclude August 9th**.
- Participants can choose to serve for:
 - **Full summer** 5/28 - 8/9
 - **1st half of summer** 5/28 - 7/7
 - **2nd half of summer** 7/1 - 8/9

What does a typical week look like?

- Here is a sample weekly schedule. Actual events in any given week may vary.



Will I have time off?

- Yes. Your work schedule will include 40 hours of paid work along with 10 hours of additional required activities each week.
- If you have an internship, you can elect to complete 30 hours of paid employment and dedicate 10 hours of unpaid time to your internship requirements. Or, you can work for 40 hours/week and complete your internship hours outside of your work assignment.
- You will have two days off per week.
- You can take 1 full week of unpaid vacation per summer.

Where will I live?

- You will live on grounds in dorm-style housing. Most residences have air conditioning, and all have screened windows. A security deposit of \$25/week will be charged and refunded to you at the end of your season of service, pending a satisfactory inspection of your living area upon departure.
- You will live in a bedroom with 1-3 roommates in a house with 6-12 other S.A.L.T. staff.
- Bathrooms are shared between approximately 4 people.
- Bed linens are provided for you. Please bring your own towel(s) and pillow(s).
- Laundry facilities (coin-operated) are available on the grounds.

Are meals provided?

- 7 meals are provided in our dining room as part of your compensation. Basic breakfast and lunch items are available in your house.
- You will be responsible for purchasing your personal food and will have an assigned food storage area in the shared kitchen.
- If you do not have a car, transportation will be provided for grocery store trips as scheduled by the house lead.
- Communal meals will be shared throughout the week and preparation will be rotated among S.A.L.t. Team members.

How much will I get paid?

- \$400 weekly stipend.

How do I qualify for an internship?

- Work with your advisor from your sending institution and S.A.L.t. Program Director to arrange an internship that meets the requirements of your sending institution.
- Submit all paperwork to the S.A.L.t. Program Director prior to your arrival.
- Work with the Program Director to confirm your goals and needs. Remember this is YOUR internship and you are responsible for getting the information and planning your time.
- Meet with the GLCC staff member who will supervise your internship on a weekly basis

Are there medical facilities nearby?

- Yes. The town of Ripon has doctors and dentists as well as a community clinic, emergency room, and hospital. Pharmacies, including Walgreens and Ripon Drug, are located in Ripon. Larger medical facilities are available in Fond du Lac and Oshkosh.
- You will be asked to complete a medical form prior to arrival. This is for your safety and is private

Are there places to shop for groceries, and personal items?

- Yes. The town of Ripon has a large grocery store, and the town of Berlin has a WalMart. Trips to Fond du Lac or Oshkosh can be arranged in advance.

Is there internet service and wi-fi available in the residence?

- Internet service is available in each residence.

Who is teaching discipleship and leadership?

- These subjects will be facilitated by a variety of practitioners in the fields. Some facilitators will come from the Green Lake Conference Center staff, others from various Christian denominations. There will be face to face sessions and sessions via videoconference. Teaching sessions will include discussion, small group interaction and limited assignments for further study and reflection.
